PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 1559, EMER-GENCY WARTIME SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT, 2003

REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 172]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 172, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of H.R. 1559, the Emergency Wartime Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2003, under an open rule. The rule provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appropriations.

The rule waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The rule further waives points of order against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI (prohibiting unauthorized appropriations or legislative provisions in a general appropriations bill). The rule provides that the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. The rule authorizes the Chair to accord priority in recognition to Members who have preprinted their amendments in the Congressional Record.

Finally, the rule provides one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

The waiver of all points of order against consideration of the bill in the rule includes a waiver of clause 4(a) of rule XIII (requiring a three-day layover of the committee report), which is necessary because the report was not filed until Wednesday, April 2, 2003, and the bill may be considered as early as Thursday, April 3, 2003.
