1st and 2nd Quarters, Fiscal Year 2003

In Division B of the Military Construction Appropriations Act, 2001 (P.L. 106-246) (the "Emergency Supplemental Act, 2000"), Congress appropriated \$1.3 billion in FY 2000 emergency supplemental funding to support counternarcotics activities associated with Plan Colombia. This funding included \$1.018 billion appropriated to the Department of State and \$300.6 million appropriated to the Department of Defense (DoD). Section 3204(e) of Public Law 106-246 requires the President to provide Congress with a semi-annual report setting forth an accounting of any costs incurred by any department, agency, or other entity of the Executive Branch during the two previous fiscal quarters in support of Plan Colombia.

Further, Public Law (P.L.) 107-115 provided \$625 million in FY 2002 to the Department of State for the Andean Counterdrug Initiative (ACI), along with up to \$35 million authorized to be transferred to the ACI account from appropriations provided for International Narcotics Control and Law Enforcement (INCLE). In FY 2002, \$20 million was transferred from the INCLE account to the ACI account.

Public Law (P.L.) 108-7 provided \$700 million in FY 2003 to the Department of State for the Andean Counterdrug Initiative (ACI). This amount was reduced to \$695 million due to a 0.65 percent government-wide rescission of budget authority. P.L. 108-7 also authorized the transfer of up to \$31 million to the ACI account from appropriations provided for International Narcotics Control and Law Enforcement. These ACI resources principally provided follow-on support to Plan Colombia activities initiated with FY 2000 emergency appropriations. Pursuant to the statutory requirement of P.L. 106-246, the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) has prepared this *Plan Colombia Semi-Annual Obligation Report* and *Andean Counterdrug Initiative Report* covering the first and second quarters of FY 2003.

To fulfill this reporting requirement, ONDCP has worked closely with the Departments of State and Defense, as well as the Office of Management and Budget, to develop an accounting report on spending in support of Plan Colombia. ONDCP's guidance to agencies for preparing input for this report carefully defines how obligations are displayed, in order to present Congress with the most accurate accounting of how budget resources have been executed. Of note is the convention employed to present spending data for the Department of State. Of the \$1.018 billion appropriated to State for Plan Colombia, all except \$5.5 million has been obligated in bilateral agreements with host governments, including the Government of Colombia. Some program elements supported with funds obligated under these bilateral agreements are being executed by the Department of State through the "subobligation" (through actual commitments of funds in contracts, grants, and other procurement actions) of these funds. Other program elements supported with funds obligated under these bilateral agreements are being executed by other U.S. agencies, such as the Justice Department, under interagency transfer or allocation agreements with State. Accordingly, this report provides

information on subobligations incurred by State for program elements directly executed by State, as well as amounts reported as subobligated by other agencies that received resources from State. The agency subobligation rate for both the Plan Colombia account (FY 2000 appropriation) and the ACI account (FY 2002 and FY 2003 appropriations) is summarized below:

Funds Appropriated to State:

Of the \$1.018 billion appropriated to the Department of State for Plan Colombia, \$954.8 million had been subobligated as of March 31, 2003. One new program element in this report, derived from reprogrammed funds, is \$5 million for the protection of President Uribe and other senior members of the Colombian government. Through March 31, 2003, \$3.940 million in funding for this activity had been subobligated.

As of March 31, 2003, the Department of State and United States Agency for International Development (AID) had subobligated \$443.1 million of the \$645 million provided to the ACI account for Fiscal Year 2002. Given the timing of the 2002 appropriation action, funding was not available for obligation until mid-March of last year for the ACI account – contributing to the low subobligation rate.

ACI funding for FY 2003 is \$695.5 million. As of March 31, 2003, the Department of State had subobligated \$7 million of this total, while AID was unable to subobligate any of their FY 2003 appropriation. Similar to the previous year, the timing of the FY 2003 appropriation contributed to this low subobligation rate.

Funds Appropriated to Defense:

Of the \$300.6 million appropriated to the DoD under Division B of Public Law 106-246, \$282.2 million, or 94 percent, had been obligated as of March 31, 2003.
