

The publication of "Heads of Families, The First Census of the United States, 1790—Virginia" brings to three the number of reprints completed in this series.

The census records on South Carolina and North Carolina were completed and released earlier this year.

In all, original census records are available on 12 states. At least two more volumes, probably Pennsylvania and New York, will be reprinted next year. The records on other states will be undertaken from time to time until the entire set is completed.

Reprint Company now has under way Heritage Series of reprints on South Carolina and North Carolina with the following volumes completed:
