Institutional Infrastructure

The FY 2002 INS budget includes \$74.6 million to provide additional infrastructure to accommodate INS' rapid growth in personnel and enforcement capability over the past seven years. FY 2002 infrastructure projects are focused on construction of Border Patrol stations and detention facilities.
