R E P O R T

[To accompany H. Res. 464]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 464, by a non-record vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of the bill (S. 5) to amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for human embryonic stem cell research. The resolution provides for one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce.

The resolution waives all points of order against the bill and its consideration except those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI. The bill shall be considered as read. The resolution provides one motion to commit. Finally, the resolution permits the Chair, during consideration of the bill, to postpone further consideration of it to a time designated by the Speaker.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

Although the rule waives all points of order against the bill and its consideration (except for those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI), the Committee is not aware of any points of order against the bill or its consideration. The waivers of all points of order against the bill and its consideration (except for those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI) are prophylactic in nature.
